Dress Code: Obeying Islamic rules including Hijab or Islamic dress code is necessary in Iran.

Color: There is no limitation in this respect.

Men's clothing: Shorts are not acceptable in public places. Wearing ties or bows is not a problem. T-shirt is acceptable.

Women's clothing: Body should be covered with loose clothes like men's shirt, jacket or manteau. Arms should not be bare. Legs should be covered down to knees.

Women's hair should be covered. It does not mean you shall have a tight scarf around your head. Don't worry, it is very usual that some parts remain out of the cover. Scarf is the most common covering for head and is called "Roosari" in Farsi.

Tip: Once a Chador is required, like in holy places, it will be given upon entrance.

Greeting: The most common greeting in Iran is "salaam" which literally means "peace" and translates to "Hello/Salute". When Iranians meet each other they shake hands and sometimes kiss on the cheeks and hug each other depending on the closeness and type of relationship between people.

- Tip 1: It is common that men hug each other and kiss each other's cheeks.
- Tip 2: It is common that women hug each other and kiss each other's cheeks.
- Tip 3: Men should not attempt to kiss or shake hands with ladies unless she voluntarily does it.
