What you need to know about

Working in Iran

when visiting Iran...





A foreign national person should have a work permit to work in Iran.

In order to apply for a work permit, the applicant should enter Iran on work visa and apply for work permit within one month after entering the country.

Tip 1: It is not possible to convert a tourist or business visa to work visa inland.

Tip 2: The work visa is valid for 3 months.

Once the work permit is issued, the applicant should apply for residence permit.

Tip 3: The Work Permit issued or renewed for a maximum period of one year.



The work permit can be issued for:

- 1. A foreign citizen residing in Iran for at least ten years.
- 2. A foreign citizen who has an Iranian wife.
- 3. Immigrants from foreign countries, especially Islamic countries and political refugees, provided they have a valid immigration or refugee card, and after the written consent of the ministries of the country and foreign countries.

In cases where the foreign national's employment relationship is discontinued with the employer, he/ she is obliged to submit the work permit to the Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs within fifteen days and get a receipt.

The Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs, if necessary, will request the expulsion of the foreign national from the competent authorities.
